CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is a motion by Senator DeCamp to suspend Rule 6, Section 3, Rule 7, Section 3, and vote without further amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp. The call is raised.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, there has been a number of amendments. There has been a lot of negotiation and I think maybe short of some agreement and I thought maybe there might be one for a while, but short of some agreement I almost think it is not unreasonable to say it is time to repeal or not to repeal and that is what you would be voting on in the bill and, whether you are for or against it, I think it is time to bring it to a head and then if it did happen to advance to Select File and some agreement was reached, then you could sure put that on there. But I think we are about that time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Mr. President and members of the body, I am, quite frankly, not that unsympathetic of what Senator DeCamp just said. Frankly, if his motion would have happened to have been in line after one other amendment that is, I know, going to be considered here on General File, had been considered, I probably would have voted in favor of this motion to suspend the rules and get on with the situation. As I understand it, there are two compromise proposals...two proposals being floated around and that is unfortunate when people can't get their act...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me, Senator Withem, Senator DeCamp, do I understand that you wish to withdraw your motion?

SENATOR DECAMP: Let his motion go ahead of it, that's fine by me.

SENATOR WITHEM: Other than the fact that it is not my motion, I was just speaking to the bill, but (interruption) I would be happy to do that.
