SENATOR CARSTEN: The question has been called for. Do I see five hands? I do. All those in favor of ceasing debate will vote aye...well, first of all, do you want to close, Senator Goodrich? All those in favor of ceasing debate will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk. Oh, you're right. I was thinking we were on that. Have you all voted on the Goodrich amendment to the...cease debate, excuse me. I want to go home too. Have you all voted? Senator Goodrich.

SENATOR GOODRICH: (Microphone not activated.) ...to cease debate.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes, on cease debate.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Where are some of these guys at? One more. There we go.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Debate is ceased. Now, Senator Goodrich, do you want to close?

SENATOR GOODRICH: No.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Question is, shall the Goodrich amendment be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 17 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Goodrich's amendment to the committee amendments, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Goodrich's amendment is adopted. Now we are back on the bill as amended, unless you have another amendment? Yes, back on...do you have anything? Okay. Back on the committee amendments as amended now. Senator Nelson, on the committee amendments as amended.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I support the committee amendments as amended. And I think Senator Schmit has very eloquently described the bill. I, too, had many reservations. I am one of the supporters, and I intend to work to support it. As anything or any accomplishment of this size, there are many hurdles to be overcome. I will mention to you
