SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you, Senator Nichol. The question is, shall the Nichol amendment to LB 1251 be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? We'll give you another 30 seconds. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, I ask for a call of the house and I'll accept call ins.

SENATOR CARSTEN: A call of the house has been requested with call ins. All those in favor of going under call will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 11 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The house is under call. All those in the Chamber, please take your seat and press your green button. All unauthorized personnel will please leave the floor. Those outside the Chamber that can hear me, please return to your chair and register your presence. Haberman, Senator Hannibal, Senator Harris, Senator Labedz, Senator Smith, Senator Warner. Call in votes are acceptable. We're voting on the Nichol amendment to LB 1251. Senator Haberman. Senator Warner, will you press your button, please. Thank you. Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Hope for a roll call vote, please, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: A roll call has been requested. Please keep your voices down now so the Clerk can hear your vote. You may proceed with a roll call vote on the Nichol amendment, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 1828-29 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The Nichol amendment is adopted. Do we have anything more on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The call is raised.

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
