

accompanied by their teachers and bus driver. If you would rise we would welcome you to the Legislature. Now, where were we at when we left off before lunch, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, 1251, mainline appropriations bill. I have a series of amendments pending. The first is by Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers' amendment is on page 1653 of the Journal.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Chambers, please.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman and members of the Legislature, I can tell you what this amendment is. I only regret that there are so few people here because it would have perhaps rough sledding even at best. But it is designed to return a percentage of the funding to the Mexican-American Commission and to the Commission on Indian Affairs. The percentage amount is the same as that...as the amount that was restored to the Commission on the Status of Women. I hate to prolong the discussion, but I've got to try to get some more people here. So, what I think I'm going to do is withdraw that amendment and offer it later. I don't have any choice. Mr. Chairman.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Yes.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'm going to withdraw that amendment and offer it later.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Very good. Is there any objection? So ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers would move to amend. Senator Vickers' amendment is on page 1691 of the Journal.
