SENATOR MARSH: Mr. Speaker, I'm going to request a call of the house and a roll call vote after we have all checked in.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor say aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The house is under call. Please register your presence. All those not in the Chamber, please report to the Chamber and register your presence. The house is under call. Please look to see if your light is on in front of you. The house is under call. Senator McFarland, please. Senator Chambers, please. Senator Chronister, would you record your presence. Senator Hoagland, please. Senator Landis, would you record your presence, please. Senator Labedz, would you report to the Chamber, please. Senator Vickers, please report to the Chamber. Senator Chambers, please report to the Chamber, the house is under call. Senator Vickers, please. Senator Marsh, I am informed that both Senator Chambers and Senator Vickers are on their way. Are you ready to proceed, or would you rather wait? Would you proceed? Is that correct? Mr. Clerk, would you call the roll, please. Would you please take your seats and be quiet so the Clerk can hear the roll, please.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1844 of the Legislative Journal.) 14 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: The amendment fails. Are there further amendments on the desk, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, Senator Sieck would move to amend the bill. (Sieck amendment appears on page 1844 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Senator Sieck.
