

of it as it is. But I would hope we could consider what amendments are left and if they add money, by and large turn them down and then wait and see where we are at with the new projections, a little time to look at things. But as far as any additional funding today, or authorized funding today, it ought not to be done.

SENATOR CARSTEN PRESIDING

SENATOR CARSTEN: Any other discussion of the Johnson amendment? If not, Senator Johnson, would you like to close, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Thank you, Mr. President. Very briefly, I would just say that the program has been utilized by a number of farm families across the State of Nebraska and I believe that it is a worthwhile program and one that should receive the funding. I recognize the dilemma that Senator Warner is expressing. I guess, as I said, on the Farmers in Transition Program earlier this afternoon that Senator Vickers offered that if you look down the list of different programs and bills that we have been discussing this year, there have been very few things that we have done for agriculture that we could actually hang our hat on and say we have actually really done something positive and at least this is one approach that may help people not in the condition that those of the Farmers in Transition where they are actually looking for employment outside of the agricultural sector, but rather these are people that are trying to better manage their farms right now. And I guess this is an opportunity to keep them solvent and to allow them to better manage their assets at this time. So I would move for the adoption of the amendment which adds \$50,000 to this particular program.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, the question is, shall the Johnson amendment be adopted? All those in favor of the amendment vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, I would simply ask for a record vote, please.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Have you all voted that care to? We will give you a few more seconds. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 1847-48 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the
