tax authority of these institutions is one thing that has dissuaded some of you from supporting this amendment but nevertheless they play an important role in job training and other efforts that are vital to our economic future and development. And so because of that I think the state has to recognize the need to support them adequately. I would defer the rest of my time to Senator Baack.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes. Mr. Speaker and colleagues, Senator Wesely has done a good job in talking about how this is really...what it is is a fairness issue and I think we need to put the tech community colleges along with the rest of the institutions of higher education in the state because they do provide a very valuable service and do provide some good service, especially out in the more rural areas. So I would urge you to adopt this amendment. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. The question is, shall the Baack, Wesely, et al, amendment be adopted? All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Have you all voted? Thirty seconds to vote. Have you all voted? Senator Baack, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR BAACK: I guess I will ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, please.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Call of the house has been requested. All those in favor of going under call will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 8 ayes, 13 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SENATOR CARSTEN: We are not under call. Senator Baack, do you want a roll call or shall we record the vote as is?

SENATOR BAACK: Record the vote.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 13 nays, Mr. President, to adopt the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The amendment is not adopted. Do you have anything further on the bill, Mr. Clerk?
