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Though to be truthful with you, Senator Goodrich, it's been a long time since I've looked at veterans disabilities. I think, as a matter of veterans laws, that when a veteran is like at 60 percent or higher I think that the Veterans Administration then classifies that 100 percent disabled, but I could be wrong on that. That is my...

SENATOR GOODRICH: We can check this out between now and Select File then. Thank you. I would wholeheartedly support the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, do you wish to speak further on the substance of the amendment? I take not. Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise to support the committee amendment and commend Senator Hall for bringing it to us. I would like to respond to Senator Labedz's statement that she feels that the counties will do more policing if they are going to pick up 10 percent of the tab. We brought this up at the committee hearing. The county assessors tell us that all they do is fill out the application blank with the applicant, and then have them sign it and send it to Lincoln. They cannot see or ask for the applicant to submit their income data to them. So the responsibility really falls onto the state tax commissioner when they get those forms back. So I just wanted to bring this up to the body on what we heard at the committee hearing.

PRESIDENT: Senator Haberman, Senator Haberman, do you wish to speak on the substance of this amendment? Very well. Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. I don't know if it is proper to speak now or not. If they are talking about the veterans exemption then I would like to ask Senator Johnson, and it just occurred to me while you were discussing Senator Tim Hall's proposed amendment, the exemption for the veterans injured or disabled in the line of duty. I am wondering if the same could apply to those people engaged in the protection of the citizens, such as the highway patrolmen and police officers, or correctional officers who are disabled in the line of their duty. I'm not talking about when they are home, or when they are driving to and from the grocery store, or anything, but only if they are disabled in the line of duty. What would be your feelings on that, Senator Johnson?
