While that process is going on, let me acknowledge that we have some constituents from Senator Rogers' district here, they are seven seniors from the Wolbach High in Wolbach, Nebraska, accompanied by their teacher. They are under the north balcony. Will they stand and be recognized by the Nebraska Legislature, please. Thank you for coming today. Senator Johnson, please check in. Senator Schmit, please check in. Senators Goodrich, Schmit, and Nelson, please check in. Senator Smith, there are only two that are not here that are supposed to be here. May we proceed with the roll call, or how would you like to proceed with the vote?

SENATOR SMITH: I think that we can go ahead and proceed. But I would like to ask for a roll call vote in reverse order. I must tell you that I stood to be corrected by Senator Hannibal, a moment ago, in the fact that I asked for a record vote and I should have asked for my call first.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. We'll have a roll call vote in reverse. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1877 of the Legislative Journal.) 18 ayes, 12 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment fails. We are now on the advancement of the bill. Senator Johnson, would you like to so move.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I would move advancement of LB 1258. I think the issues have been pretty well discussed. I think you understand the issues and you also understand that there is some change in philosophy on the funding of the homestead exemption. It is temporary only. It is designed to hold us until we can deal with a long-range fix. I'd ask your support for the bill. We have an awful lot of people missing for one reason or another. I'll need each of you to vote to put this bill on Select File.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Johnson, there are no other lights. It is your turn to close. Do you wish to close as well?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: No.

SENATOR LANDIS: Waiving closing. We'll proceed to a vote on the advancement of 1258. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. Raise the call. The Clerk will record.
