

when he got up and supported one of my amendments. Thank you, Senator Warner, I really appreciate this. Now, Senator Johnson has stood there and he says we are going to have a \$25 million shortfall. He didn't even address what the special board said or he didn't even address the other issues. He just said that the Governor said, in essence, we are going to be short 25 million. Well, the Governor has been known to change his mind. I am sure you are all aware of that. Now, Senator Johnson says, if we don't know we are going to have to expand the tax base, we are a bunch of dummies. And that is what he wants to do. Well, Senator Johnson had two opportunities in his committee to expand the tax base, and what did he say? He said, no. He had three opportunities and he said, no. Sales tax on food? No. Sales tax on repair parts for railroads? No. Sales tax on repair parts for trucks? No. But now he is standing up and saying, we have to expand the sales tax on services. You know, you have got to kind of listen to what Senator Johnson says. Now, he says, let's just move this little puppy over to Select File, then we will decide what goes on. Well, now those little puppies, we call them prairie dogs and we took care of those here a few years ago, Senator Johnson. We just got rid of them, or tried to. So I say to you, that not only are we raising the sales tax to 20 percent, we are giving the authority to one person to raise it higher. But that part is evidently going to fly. But this part, to raise it now to 20 percent, I think is wrong and I would like to ask you to adopt my amendment which only removes that section that says we are going to have an increase in the income tax to 20 percent. Thank you, Mr. President.
