And, Mr. President, new resolution, LR 412 by Senator Smith asking the Legislature to go on record as being aware of the problems relating to migrant farm workers in the state. That will be laid over, Mr. President. (See pages 1885-86 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, LB 1259 was a bill that was introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Title read.) Introduced on March 27th, referred directly to General File, Mr. President. I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Warner, on LB 1259.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, 1259 you will recall is a civil action claims bill. All six claims are for attorney fees and interest on such fees. The total dollar amount is \$35,621.10. All of them are court ordered, or courts have ordered that these fees are paid. The Claims Board had made recommendations that they be paid along with the approval of the Attorney General Office and each of the Standing Committees, Judiciary, Social Services and Education have recommended payment and the procedure is by statute...that is required that they are paid. I move the bill be advanced.
