So if all three of the other categories, the buying, the selling and the renting, and the trading which is for something of value, all carries the idea of somebody profiting from this activity, why are they unwilling to modify this last provision, provide to any person? Why are they not willing to require that the provider in that instance also be motivated by a gain? Because they want a catchall provision which will ensnare the kind of students and others who might not be students that I am talking about. And, Senator Higgins, these kind of pictures are passed around out of curiosity, maybe for stimulation or sexual arousal. Who knows what evil lurks in the hearts of men and women? There was a radio program that said the Shadow knows, but I don't know whether that be true or not because I never talked to him, but that's what it says.

SENATOR LANDIS: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: He knows. So if the real intent is what the backers of this bill have said, how can my amendment weaken it? How can my amendment weaken this bill if it says that this kind of activity is engaged in for money or anything of value? I hope you will see the validity of what I am offering and adopt the amendment, and as I stated, I only have one other amendment up there and that is all that I intend to offer on the bill.

SENATOR LANDIS: I jumped the gun here, but this is on the Chambers amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The board has been open for a minute and a half. I'm going to call the vote shortly. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment fails. Are there other amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do have an amendment. I have a motion, however, prior to that offered by Senator Hoagland. Senator Hoagland would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 5, Rule 7, Section 3 and vote on the advancement of LB 788 without further amendment or debate.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Hoagland, on your motion.
