LB 829, 925, 925A

Mr. President and members, on 925 the Cancer Registry, it costs 60, 70, \$80,000, something like that. We make it clear that the money for this program comes out of the grants that we now provide for cancer research and not out of the money that is earmarked for Eppler Center. It's just a clarifying amendment that that's where the money would go to pay for this. So that's what the amendment does. It was brought to me by the university to make that clarifying amendment and I'd appreciate support for the amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: There are no lights. Do you waive closing, Senator Wesely? Then we'll proceed to a vote on the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Wesely's amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment is successful.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Hall, I believe you've returned and we now have an appropriate motion to advance 925.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. Speaker, I'd move that LB 925 be advanced from Select File to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR LANDIS: You've all heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The bill is advanced. LB 925A.

CLERK: Senator, on 925A I have no amendments to the bill.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move that LB 925A be advanced from Select File to E & R for engrossing.

SENATOR LANDIS: You've heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The motion is successful. The bill is advanced. LB 829, introduced by Senator Smith, providing long care management services for the elderly. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, on LB 829 the first order of business are E & R amendments.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments be adopted.
