CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Warner's amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: The amendment is adopted. Mr. Clerk, next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Rod Johnson would move to amend

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, I will handle the amendment. The amendment merely says, it defines what a current model is. There was some problems of what it is but the Ag Department, the University, and the manufacturers agree that a current model is any model included in the manufacturer's annual price list of tractors being offered for sale. A friendly amendment and I ask you to adopt it.

SENATOR LANDIS: You have heard the motion. All those in favor vote aye, those opposed vote no. The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Johnson's amendment.

SENATOR LANDIS: The motion is accepted. The amendment is adopted. Next amendment.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend his bill.

SENATOR HABERMAN: This is the last one. If a backlog of tractors, they can get a temporary sales permit. They still have to put in an application. They have to put in the specifications. They have to pay the fees. That is all it does. The second part is an amendment that merely corrects a reference to the Nebraska Tractor Testing Cash Fund. The third part simply corrects a reference to the OECD testing and inserts the term "procedures" instead of "The Standard Codes". It is a friendly amendment. I ask that you adopt it.
