Have you all voted on the resolution, aye or nay? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of the resolution, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. All right then we proceed... the Mother of the Year award is going to be delayed until nine forty-five. In the meantime we have other matters to proceed to. The first matter on our agenda today, if we have our cast of characters with us here, is the discussion of LB 237A. Senator Chambers, Senator Hoagland, you might want to handle Senator Chambers' motion on 237A. I think Senator Warner has the opportunity to open, if he wishes, on 237A, or else we'll take up an amendment. Senator Hoagland, this is just merely an A bill that we're trying to catch it up to the speed of the others. So, Senator Chambers is absent, we thought maybe we'd give you the opportunity to...

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Yes, I'd be happy, Mr. President, just to explain briefly this A bill. This bill started out with a fiscal note that was somewhere in the \$200,000 range. Senator Chambers has since visited with the Fiscal Office. The slant of the bill has been changed somewhat. My recollection is that the A bill is now in the \$40,000 to \$60,000 range. I would move its advancement.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to advance LB 237A. Is there further discussion? If not, the motion is to advance the bill from General File. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted on the advancement of 237A? Please record the vote.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance the A bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 997A.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 997A, offered by Senator Baack and Senator Vickers, appropriates funds for 997.
