ahead without Senator DeCamp? Senator Sieck, do you wish to proceed with the...? Okay, a roll call vote has been requested. The motion is to advance LB 890. Please answer the Clerk's call aye or nay. Call the roll.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 1909-20 of the Legislative Journal.) 28 ayes, 15 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. The bill is advanced. The call of the house is raised. Now we proceed to LB 894.

CLERK: Mr. President, 894, the first item I have are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to adopt the Enrollment and Review amendments to the bill. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried, the amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first amendment I have to the bill is by Senator Rod Johnson. (The Johnson amendment appears on page 1477 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson. May we have order in the Chamber, please. (Gavel.) Senator Johnson.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President, members, as you will recall, this bill creates a secondary mortgage market for agricultural loans. The amendment, I think, more clearly defines what loans will be guaranteed, and they have to be high loans, A or better rated bonds. Oh, I'm sorry. I thought we were on 849.

PRESIDENT: Just a little transposition there?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes, I'm sorry. Okay. I remember my amendment now. What the amendment does, for 894, is if the natural resource districts cannot fulfill their functions, they will then pass on the responsibility of carrying out the provisions of this act to the Department of Environmental Control. That is specifically what the amendment does. I think it is just simply trying to make sure that if there is a problem out there, and the natural resource district cannot handle it,
