

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Scofield amendment to P94. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. You are voting on Senator Scofield's amendment to LB 894, which has been under discussion. Please record your vote, aye or nay. Well, the Chair is having difficulty being assured that members are present to vote. The Chair will allow 30 seconds for the recording of the vote, Senator Scofield. I'm allowing 30 seconds for the recording of the vote. Please vote aye or nay on the Scofield amendment to 894. Fifteen seconds. Senator Scofield.

SENATOR SCOFIELD: I don't want to waste a lot of time. Let's just have a call of the house and a roll call vote.
