CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move that LB 894A be advanced from Select File to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to advance the bill. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The bill is advanced. Now we proceed to LB 461.

CLERK: Mr. President, 461 is on Select File and I do have E & R amendments, Senator.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor say aye. Opposed no. Motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on the bill is that by Senators Peterson, Hefner, and Beyer, and Lamb. (Amendment appears on page 1912 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Very well, Senator Peterson, do you wish to speak on this motion?

SENATOR PETERSON: Mr. President and members, this amendment is very simple. On page 5, lines 22 and 23, strike "or state". And in the amendment that was adopted, filed, was on page 1, line 7, strike "state". I have some grave concerns if this bill moves that we will, down the road, have state monies involved. And they say, well, we don't need any money right now. But I'll grant you in a couple of years you'll be paying dearly if you don't take the state out of this and that is not to say they
