Still looking for Senator Smith, Senator Morehead, Senator Hall, Senator Chambers, Senator Pirsch. Senator Pirsch, would you please return so we can begin? Please. Senator Hoagland, please come to the Chambers, promptly. Senator Hoagland. Senator Morehead, Senator Smith, please return promptly. Looking for Senator Harris.
