SENATOR HABERMAN: Senator DeCamp might possibly stand up on the legislative floor and he will tell you that it is my fault, that it was my bill last year that did all this, screwed everything up, that made it bad. I mean, he just might do these things. I don't know whether he is or not. But I will tell you what, I admit it. I've seen the light. I've seen the light and it was wrong. It was a bad bill. It isn't working. We have evidence here that there were reports that were filed that were not accepted and I have changed, I have had a change of heart and I am sure Senator DeCamp has stood on this floor and he has addressed this body and he has seen a change should be made and something has been done that should be undone. I have gotten religion now and it was wrong. We should change it. Therefore, I oppose the amendment. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Senator DeCamp, please, then Senator Withem.

SENATOR DECAMP: Question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question has been called. Do I see five hands? I do. The question is, shall debate cease? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on ceasing debate. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

ASSISTANT CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay to cease debate.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Yes, Mr. Speaker. Very briefly. As I said before, we are simply trying to correct an error that we made last year, or at least those of us that supported the bill, and many of us did, where we simply overlooked the independent accountants that are out there that are functioning in this state at this particular time. I don't see anything that they cannot do that the certified public accountants can do and I would relinquish the remainder of my time to Senator DeCamp who has requested that he offer a few comments as well to the committee amendments.
