SENATOR HABERMAN: Pull that.

SPEAKER NICHOL: It is withdrawn. Thank you.

CLERK: The next amendment I have was from Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, I just don't think there is any use wasting time on amendments. If somebody wants to get to a vote, I am all for it.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to indefinitely postpone the bill.
