

you all voted that care to? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please. A roll call vote has been requested.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1945 of the Legislative Journal.) 13 ayes, 31 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the motion fails. The call is raised. We will move on to LB 833. Then we will take up 1027 after that.

CLERK: Mr. President, 833 was a bill introduced by Senator Pappas. (Read title.) Introduced on January 9 of this year, referred to the Public Works Committee, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Schmit on the committee amendments.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President and members of the body, the committee amendments would provide limits on the overweight permits which could be issued for garbage trucks. First, a permit could exceed the maximum allowable weight by no more than 20 percent. Second, the permit fee would be increased to \$10 per month or \$100 per year. The permit could be issued for one or more months up to a year, and the term of the permit granted to be stated on the permit. And, third, the amendment stated strikes the current provision which allows the current permit provision for garbage hauliers which allows a 25 percent allowance between April 15 and July 1. Mr. President and members of the body, I think that Senator Beyer will go into this in more detail but I want to emphasize that the garbage haulers have a unique problem. We have attempted to address that problem, and I would have to say that this is probably one of the more legitimate garbage bills we have got in this body this year, and I would ask for your...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Excuse me, Senator Schmit. I am sorry, Senator Schmit. (Gavel.) We must hold it down. I can't even hear the speaker and I realize he has a problem but, please, let's respect him a little bit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Probably the best line I had all year, Senator, this is probably the only legitimate garbage bill we have got this year and I would like to ask you to adopt the committee amendments.
