tax receipts, 70 percent of them, the following year. We do limit the types of receipts that they can count to local receipts so that they don't get themselves too far out on a limb, so that it is a secure kind of opportunity. So that is, very briefly put, the purpose of the amendment and is badly needed by a number of cities in our state. So I would urge you to adopt the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Thank you. Senator Warner, did you want to speak on the Scofield amendment? No. Okay, anyone else to speak on the Scofield amendment? If not, do you have any closing, Senator Scofield?

SENATOR SCOFIELD: Unless there are questions, I will waive closing.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, the question is, shall the Scofield amendment be adopted? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the Scofield-Withem amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The Scofield amendment has been adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have one final amendment and that is by Senator Warner.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Okay, Senator Warner, on your amendment, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, this is the amendment that Senator Hartnett offered to the other amendment and like others upon reflection what concerns I may have thought I had I no longer feel I do. So if it is a proper motion, I would offer the amendment to the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Higgins, for what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR HIGGINS: A point of order.

SENATOR CARSTEN: State your point to the Chair, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: If this is the same amendment, then this is a motion to reconsider, isn't it, Senator Warner?
