

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1967 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 14 nays, 2 present and not voting, 4 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill passes without the emergency clause attached. We'll go on to LB 1250A. And this bill will take approximately 45 minutes. Mr. Clerk. The Clerk tells me it will not take that long, 30 minutes or something like that.

CLERK: (Read LB 1250A on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1250A pass with the emergency clause attached? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. It takes 33 votes. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1968 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 17 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill fails with the emergency clause attached. We will now vote on the bill without the emergency clause attached. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote. See page 1968 of the Legislative Journal.) 30 ayes, 16 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The bill passes without the emergency clause. May I introduce some guests that are just coming into the north balcony, please. They are guests of Senator Wesely. They are 120 students from Lincoln High School. They are accompanied by their teachers. Would you folks please stand so we can recognize you today. Thank you for visiting us today. You are witnessing Final Reading which, according to our Constitution, each bill, prior to voting on it on Final Reading, must be read in its entirety by the Clerk. You may not be able to follow precisely since it is read quite fast. But the next bill that we will be reading will take approximately 10 to 15 minutes, so we invite you to relax with us while you listen to Final Reading. Mr. Clerk, LB 1252.
