

SENATOR DECAMP: Very briefly. Whether you support or oppose the bill, I would ask you to support these amendments. They try to address any of the objections thus far that have been raised by different opponents. I guess I think most of them are unnecessary. At the same time they clear up some things in Senator Lamb's amendment, and they address complaints or supposed objections by opponents. So I would ask you to accept them.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Question is the adoption of the DeCamp motion. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. We're voting on the DeCamp amendment. Please vote if you care to. Voting on the DeCamp amendment. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Well, Mr. President, I'll ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.
