

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, I believe the only two left wish to call the question, so we won't need to do that. Would you like to close, Senator Hoagland, please? Would you close. We only have one more motion. Perhaps we can get to this before we adjourn for lunch.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Let me give a synopsis explanation as to why this section can now be removed. When the bill was originally introduced it totally deregulated the phone company, and as I understand, it took all authority away from the Public Service Commission. So at that point it was necessary to codify rule and regulation of the Public Service Commission. Since then the bill has been amended to leave jurisdiction over some aspects with the Public Service Commission. So their rule and regulation will stay in effect, and it's not necessary to have this statutory language. So I'd ask that Section 11 be stricken. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Hoagland amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Voting on the adoption of the Hoagland amendment. Have you all voted? Senator Hoagland, what do you think?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I'd ask for a call of the house, and if that is...ask for a call of the house.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 13 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Please illuminate your green lights. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Please return to your seats promptly. We only have one more amendment. Perhaps we can get to some kind of a decision by the time we adjourn, shortly.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You'll accept call in votes on the adoption of the Hoagland motion. I need Senator Scofield, Senator Rupp.
