SENATOR SMITH: Well, I just got it.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, why don't I wait for Senator Smith to take her amendment up and then...

SENATOR SMITH: Someone is taking it for me, Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: Okay, then I will defer to her amendment. Let me ask another question. Can her amendment just all be part of the same amendment or can you do it all as one amendment, or...?

SENATOR SMITH: I will ask for unanimous consent for that to be incorporated as a part of my original amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: No...Senator Smith, would you come up here a minute, please. We haven't seen this and we can't just do that automatically. Senator Smith, I understand you want to withdraw the old one and go on the new amendment to incorporate the two.
