I would move the adoption of the amendments, and then I'll renew the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: I understand we have an amendment to the amendment?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Haberman would move to amend the Landis amendment. On page 2, line 9, strike "may" and insert "shall". Is that right, Senator?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Yes. Senator Landis, I'm not trying to kill your bill or stall your bill, but on line 9, page 2, it says "he or she may be arrested". Would you mind if we changed that to "shall be"?

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Haberman...

SENATOR HABERMAN: We just got the bill and I haven't had time, but that struck me.

SENATOR LANDIS: Sure. I understand, although this is language that has been in the bill from the beginning. To say "shall" requires the police to arrest, and in fact you need some discretion. If they can't find them, the police will be in violation of the law if you'd written "shall" in there because he couldn't find the person to in fact arrest them.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Okay, then I have one more question. On page 4, line 9...

SENATOR LANDIS: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HABERMAN: ...it says "to make restitution of the fruits of his or her crime". I don't understand your word "fruits".

SENATOR LANDIS: I steal a VCR, I've got it in my possession. I restore the VCR back to you. Fruits is the booty, what is stolen.
