

I and II misdemeanors, and a Class IV felony, and a Class III felony.

SENATOR HIGGINS: So a Class IV felony...

SENATOR LANDIS: But specifically bodily injuries and sexual assaults are not available for this community service.

SENATOR HIGGINS: But a person that distributed child pornographic stuff, they could also get community service. That is correct inasmuch as...

SPEAKER NICHOL: Less than a half minute.

SENATOR HIGGINS: I won't take the time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Withem.

SENATOR WITHEM: Just to call the question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Pirsch.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Just a quick question. Senator Landis, are you saying that offenders who are sentenced to community service in lieu of jail are then eligible for workers' compensation?

SENATOR LANDIS: If they are on the job, working for the county, yes. It was in the bill originally, I understand.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Even though their community service is...

SENATOR LANDIS: Currently, for example, if they are on probation, they are covered by workmen's comp now. It's not much of a change.

SENATOR PIRSCH: Okay, thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. You may say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced, barely. LB 174. Senator John DeCamp.

CLERK: Mr. President, 174, the first item I have on the bill...I have no E & R amendments. Senator Wesely, I understand you want to withdraw your amendment, Senator? Mr. President, in that case I have nothing on the bill.
