

All those in favor vote (sic) aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. L. 68.

CLERK: Yes, sir. Mr. President, the first...I have E & R amendments on LB 68.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Remmers, please.

SENATOR REMMERS: I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted. Anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator Haberman. (Haberman amendment appears on page 1994 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Haberman.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, members of the body, this bill authorizes public schools to offer child care services before and after school. Now I really have no problem with that, other than philosophically should the school be in this service. But beings as the bill will probably pass, my amendment says that if a school offers this service that it comes under the same minimum regulations for day care centers that other day care centers do. Now it is important to me, and it should be important to you, and important to those children, and important to the schools that they come underneath these regulations. Senator Landis just told me he will accept the amendment, so I'll quit yakking on it and won't take up any of his time.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, did you wish to speak further on that? Question is...the question is the adoption of the Landis amendment. Mr. Clerk, do you have something? Oh, we're adopting the Haberman amendment. Excuse me, I misspoke. The question is the adoption of the Haberman amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote if you care to. Time is passing, but...Senator Marsh, you have your light on. Did you want to speak? Okay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Haberman amendment is adopted. Do you have anything else on it?
