

SPEAKER NICHOL: Roll call vote? Okay, we'll wait until people get here. We're looking for...Senator Harris, please record your presence. Senator Warner, Senator Nelson, Senator Wesely, Senator Marsh, Senator Pirsch Senator Haberman, Senator Hannibal, Senator Landis. Senator Wesely, Senator Smith. Thank you. Senator McFarland, Senator Landis. Okay, the question is the adoption of the Hartnett amendment. Okay, roll call. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1996 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The Hartnett amendment passes. Anything else on it, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: I'll move the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. The call is raised. LB 419. LB 563. I understand Senator Landis is going to handle that.

CLERK: Mr. President, 563, I have E & R on the bill, Senator.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Remmers, please.

SENATOR REMMERS: I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend, and that amendment is on page 1642 of the Journal.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this has to do with historic preservation. You'll recall, on General File, Senator Warner, Senator Hoagland talked about possible amendments to accommodate the Department of Roads. This limits the scope of the bill and indicates that for the purposes of historic buildings, the historic preservation officer must be consulted. Originally the bill meant all kinds of things,
