SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to adopt the amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Do you want to move the bill, please? The question is, shall the bill advance? All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced, barely. LB 309.

CLERK: Mr. President, 309, I do have E & R amendments pending.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Remmers.

SENATOR REMMERS: Mr. Chairman, I move that the E & R amendments be approved.

SPEAKER NICHOL: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted. Anything else on the bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senators Schmit and Vickers would move to amend. (Schmit-Vickers amendment appears on pages 1997-98 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, Senator Vickers asked me to take this amendment. The amendment is a very simple one. It says that when there is interbasin transfer of water you must take note of the impact upon the receiving basin as well as the impact upon the sending basin. I move the adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Harris, please.

SENATOR HARRIS: Yes. In the absence of Senator Vickers, and then for a little while in the absence of Senator Schmit, I was going to take this amendment. I looked it over and it looks like a very good idea to me. So I urge the adoption of the
