CLERK: 25 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return the bill.

We have in the bill, you lose it for ten years. The amendment makes it fifteen years as I feel that is a better balance than ten years. So we are still not having a lifetime suspension. We are having it at fifteen years instead of ten.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: (No response.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chizek, please..

SENATOR CHIZEK: A question for Senator Haberman.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Would you respond, please, Senator Haberman?
