the retirement plan of these judges. Mr. President, I don't have the votes to kill this bill, but I just wanted to get this into the record. I feel that this...killing this bill would be like climbing Mt. Everest barefooted or like pushing a wet noodle, and so with this information, I am asking permission to withdraw this motion. Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Any objection to withdrawal of the motion? If not, so ordered. Mr. Clerk, will you proceed with the reading of LB 1129.

CLERK: (Read LB 1129 on Final Reading.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 1129 pass? All those in favor will vote aye, those opposed will vote no. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I would like us to check in and then I'll ask for a roll call vote, and for the record, does this require 30 votes, Mr. Clerk?

SENATOR CARSTEN: 25 I believe, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Thank you.

SENATOR CARSTEN: A check in and a roll call vote has been requested. Would you please push your green button to register your presence. After we have all pushed our green buttons we will then have the Clerk call the roll. Senator McFarland, Senator Nichol, please. Senator Higgins, would you give us your green light, please. I believe they're all here, Senator Chambers, we have one excused. Proceed with a roll call vote on the advancement of 1129, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 2063 of the Legislative Journal.) 25 ayes, 22 nays, Mr. President, on the passage of the bill.

SENATOR CARSTEN: LB 1129 passes. Do you have anything to read in, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, Senator Lamb would ask unanimous consent to bracket LB 1054 on E & R for Engrossment.
