

PRESIDENT: Is there objection? Do you have, Mr. Clerk...there is objection.

SENATOR DECAMP: Then I would move to indefinitely bracket.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to indefinitely bracket LR 16. Can we take it up now? All right, the adjective indefinitely means nothing. In our rules it is the motion to bracket the bill. Is there discussion on that? I will go through the list here. Senator Sieck.

SENATOR SIECK: Mr. President, I agree with Senator DeCamp that we indefinitely postpone or bracket.

PRESIDENT: Senator Harris.

SENATOR HARRIS: I would like to ask a couple of questions of Senator DeCamp, if that is okay.

PRESIDENT: Very well, Senator DeCamp is available.

SENATOR DECAMP: Yes, sir.

SENATOR HARRIS: This will not have a date, just bracket.

SENATOR DECAMP: That is correct. I am taking the approach that a petition drive, difficult as it might be, is probably the proper way to go. There is enough information and education in the public's mind and, therefore, further pursuit of LR 16 would jeopardize that petition drive and further attempts to try to reach compromise here would do the same and, therefore, I am just saying let's pass over, if you would, LR 16, bracket it or whatever you want to call it, and I will get to work. And, of course, so will those on the other side.

SENATOR HARRIS: That is all I have. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature, I have a more direct way of doing away with this resolution and that is to kill it and I have such a motion up there, and if there is going to be no attempt to bring this thing back this session, I think that motion to indefinitely postpone is the one we ought to consider, and just take a vote on the bracket, and
