LB 217, 600A

SENATOR HIGGINS: Excuse me, I have no objections.

PRESIDENT: All right, unless there is objection, the bill is bracketed in accordance with the Senator's request and he will proceed accordingly, Senator. And then we have LB 1016. We will pass over LB 1016 for the present time. The next one to be taken up is LB 217. Are there E & R amendments to 217?

CLERK: Mr. President, the first thing I have on 217 are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion to adopt the Enrollment and Review amendments to 217. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment to the bill. The first amendment to the bill is by Senator Vickers. Senator, this is the amendment you had printed on 865. I understand you want to withdraw that one. Is that right?

SENATOR VICKERS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is withdrawn.

CLERK: The next amendment I have, Mr. President, is by Senator Vickers. Senator, this is the one you had on page 481 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vickers.

SENATOR VICKERS: Mr. President and members, this, if you will recall, LB 217 is a bill to regulate the locations of underground storage tanks in this state and was admitted on General File to include a mechanism to regulate the location of all underground storage tanks of hazardous materials, including smaller underground storage tanks that might be owned by individuals for their own use with a one-time registration. The amendment that I am offering to this was drafted a year ago or a very similar amendment was drafted a year ago but was never...and was taken to the committee that this bill was heard in, the Agriculture Committee, of which I am a member, but I
