PRESIDENT: One minute.

SENATOR VICKERS: You better set up a mechanism if you are concerned about future costs. You better set up a mechanism to encourage that early reporting because that future cost...and a super fund will come some day, I don't know when but it will come some day, and when it comes it is going to cost an awfully lot more than it does right now. It is going to cost an awful lot more than this will, I can tell you that. I urge adoption of this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: The motion is the adoption of the Vickers amendment to LB 217. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. We are voting on a motion offered by Senator Vickers which would amend LB 217. Please record your vote. The Chair will allow 30 seconds for the recording of votes. May we have all the interested members please attend to this motion and record their vote either aye or nay. It is the Vickers amendment to LB 217. Fifteen seconds has elapsed. Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 4 ayes, 17 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment fails. Next on the bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Vickers, you had a second amendment, Senator, on page 482. No. Okay. Mr. President, the next two amendments I have were filed by Senator Beutler.

SENATOR LANDIS: I would ask to withdraw those as co-introducer of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The amendments are withdrawn.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have is by Senator Landis. Senator, your amendment is on page 1842.
