in compliance on a massive scale. So I suggest that we strike the word "daily" and it will read at that point "an inventory control procedure for any tank used to hold petroleum products or hazardous substance for resale", as opposed to "a daily". I move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. I will accept the amendment. While it would be true that in large commercial ventures there would be a daily inventory control procedure, it may be possible for smaller commercial ventures not to be able to comply with that. I think it is a reasonable amendment. I will be happy to accept it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hefner.

SENATOR HEFNER: Mr. President and members of the body, I rise to support this amendment. I want to commend Senator Harris for bringing it to us. It is true that most of those in the business do take a daily inventory but to some of them it creates a hardship. So I feel that this is a good amendment and I would urge you to vote for it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you, Senator. Anything further on the Harris amendment? Senator Harris, you may close. The motion is to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Harris to LB 217. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Please record your vote on the Harris amendment to LB 217. Record your vote aye or nay, please. Please record your vote. The motion before us is the adoption of an amendment by Senator Harris to LB 217. Please record your vote aye or nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Harris's amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Very well. Senator Landis, I guess you may move to advance.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you. I do have a statement to make for the record very briefly.
