LB 217A, 217

PRESIDENT: Very well.

SENATOR LANDIS: Senator Schmit has been kind enough to pose a question to me that he would like read into the record and my response read into the record and I would be happy to oblige Senator Schmit. His question is, Senator Landis, as I understand it, the 1100 gallon and smaller tanks are exempt from the provisions of this bill except for registration. Once these tanks are registered and the fee is paid, are there any other provisions of LB 217 which would apply? And the answer to the question is this, that for residential and farm uses that is absolutely true, registration and registration only for 1100 gallon tanks or smaller. A commercial tank is not a farm tank or a residential tank. They would be covered by the other provisions but with respect to residential tanks and farm tanks, and by the way, the overwhelming vast majority are smaller than 1100 gallons, they will only be covered by registration provisions and no other provisions in the bill. With that, I would move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to advance LB 217 from Select File. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. Motion carried, the bill is advanced. The next then, LB 217A.

CLERK: Mr. President, 217A is on Select File. The first item I have are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. Motion carried, the amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment, I assume, Senator Landis, by yourself.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This creates cash funds and since the bill has undergone some amendment it is necessary to distribute these cash funds appropriately and the cash funds wind up going to the State Fire Marshal's Office and to the Department of Environmental Control. It makes some variations in what our original figures were but it simply redistributes the cash funds that would be available through the
