PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on adoption of Senator Lundy's amendment, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Schmit would move to amend and Senator Schmit's amendment is on page 1322 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, members, my amendment is merely a technical amendment. In one place in the bill we spoke about certified mail or registered mail. In another we spoke only about registered mail. My amendment clarifies that the notice will be required to be sent by registered mail and I urge that you adopt this amendment.
