CLERK: 27 ayes, 4 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance LB 1124.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. The next one is the A bill, 1124A.

CLERK: Mr. President, on the A bill I do have E & R amendments, Senator Hall.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall, E & R to 1124A.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I'd move the E & R amendments be adopted.

PRESIDENT: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. The motion carried. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend the bill. (Wesely amendment appears on page 2131 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you, Mr. President. With the passage of the Bank Tax Bill there is a reduction of 20,000 in the A bill for the following year. Beyond that, because of the amendment we adopted and the review process to make sure the public and the Legislature is aware of the tax credit and his receiving it, there is an additional 30,000 that is needed for the following year, so we reduce and then add, but appreciate your support for the amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Wesely, do you have any idea how much money this is going to cost the state in loss of tax revenue?
