

plant had only 15 percent of Nebraska's ethanol market at ADC1, in spite of its commitment to 7 locations, from Sidney to Omaha, more than any other supplier of ethanol in the state, and the only supplier west of Grand Island. Large scale plants are predatory pricing, and this is what would happen in Nebraska. They sell 80 percent of their product in their local area, at a higher price. Then they use the incremental costing and pricing and sell their product at a much lower price in Nebraska. They have produced a subsidy in the state which they operate in, which is unconstitutional in Nebraska. The plant in Hastings can't sell in Colorado and Montana because of restrictive legislation in those states. So this multitiering pricing system, by large companies as has been documented, is unfair price practice suits. The purpose of the amendment then is to stimulate investment in Nebraska and to support the smaller plants. Thank you. I urge your support.
