CLERK: Mr. President, the next amendment I have to the bill is by Senators Hoagland, Eret, and Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Okay, Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Is that AM2858, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: No, sir, it is 2860. It's on page 2007 of the Journal, Senator.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I wonder if we might take amendment 2858 first, if we can switch 2858 and 2860.

CLERK: So are you...you want to withdraw this other one, Senator, or just...

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Can we just switch them, just flip-flop them?

CLERK: Okay. AM2860, Mr. President, is on page...it is printed separately in your bill books.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. President, colleagues, AM2858 is printed separately in your bill books. And AM2858 is essentially a technical rewrite of AM2584 that we adopted earlier. The same cadre of individuals participated in this rewrite, representatives of the Nebraska Bankers Association, representatives of the Credit Union League, including savings and loan...I'm sorry, the Savings and Loan Association representatives, particularly those concerned about home mortgages in the urban areas, representatives of the Center for Rural Affairs among the proponents of the bill, representatives of Senator Eret's office and Senator Rod Johnson's office, and Judiciary Committee staff. And AM2858 has been signed off on by those groups, and basically makes a series of technical amendments intended to clarify the bill. It is basically noncontroversial. And I'd ask the adoption of that set of amendments, AM2858, printed in your bill book.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the adoption of an amendment by Senator Hoagland to 999. (Gavel.) Any discussion? Motion is to adopt the amendment offered by Senator Hoagland.
