

1986 and 1987. So, for those reasons, Mr. President, I would urge this body to make that policy statement. We want to help people now to the extent we are allowed to, constitutionally, and adopt this amendment. Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Motion is the adoption of the amendment offered by Senator Hoagland to 999. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for the recording of your vote. Please vote, aye or nay, on the Hoagland amendment. Please vote, aye or nay, on the Hoagland amendment to 999. Ten seconds to record your vote. Please record your vote. If you members would give us your attention please. The motion before us is the Hoagland amendment to 999. Senator Hoagland, I'm going to ask for the vote.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I'd ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Call of the house has been requested. Question is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.

PRESIDENT: Motion carried, the house is under call. Will all members please record your presence here. Put your green lights on. Members at your desks, in your chairs. Are you in your chair, Senator Beyer? All right. Senator Scofield, please. Senator Pirsch, Senator Nelson, please. Senator DeCamp, Senator Goll, Senator Hartnett, Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Harris, and Senator Haberman. The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Rod Johnson. Senator Rod Johnson is excused. Senator Haberman, Senator Abboud. Vard Johnson, Haberman, and Abboud, please come to the Chamber. A request has been made for a roll call in reverse order. Senator Haberman, Senator Abboud, and Senator Vard Johnson, please, the house is under call. Senator Johnson, Haberman, and Abboud, please come to the Chamber, please. The house is under call. Senator Hoagland, do you wish to proceed in reverse order now? There are two more to come? Senator Vard Johnson and Senator Haberman. Vard Johnson is in the Governor's office, and he's on...they've informed him, and Senator Haberman is on his way.
