

morning and worked out a set of amendments with one of their representatives that Senator Eret and I are co-sponsoring and that are up next that will clarify certain other provisions. But they now come in requesting this additional bite which really for all practical purposes is going to I think render virtually a nullity of the partial redemption provisions of the bill so I would urge that you reject this amendment. And I would urge that you reject this amendment particularly in light of the fact that we are not going to have retroactive application, evidently, of LB 999 so it is not nearly the same situation it would have been if there were retroactive application. Make no mistake about it, if this amendment is adopted, why much of the heart of the bill is going to be cut out. I would urge the rejection of the amendment.
