

tomorrow. They may have started one yesterday. On the other hand, this farming situation that we are trying to grapple with reflects a way of life, something that did not just spring up on a whim. There are many people in the city, and I don't know whether Senator Lynch and others of us on this floor are aware of it, who are encouraged to start small businesses when one of the most certain things to fail in this society is the small business. If you hate somebody with a passion, the greatest way to get even with them is to help them get started in a small business because they are doomed to failure in the majority of instances. So we are not even dealing with the same kind of economic dynamics and everybody knows that. There are bankers and other groups who had not opposed this bill in the beginning, then they decided they wanted to oppose it by stratagem, sub rosa, not come right out and say that they are backing up and violating the agreement that they made. I was upstairs in my office, I think, when this bill may have been discussed. It was being discussed by the Judiciary Committee and I came down and Mr. Brandt was testifying, and I was able to say without hearing his testimony the points he raised in opposition to this bill because I knew the way Mr. Brandt's mind operated as a representative of those banking interests, and sure enough, he had to say kind of sheepish, well, that is right, Senator, I did say that, and others began to kind of chuckle. I know these people. I have heard them down through the years and I listen to them. So Mr. Brandt and the others started saying we have nothing against partial redemption because it was spoken of when I came down there, maybe before, in terms of allowing somebody to keep a roof over his or her head. We discuss these things on the floor as though they occur in a vacuum separate from the real world. But when I pick up the paper, I am reading about various Jewish groups having seminars and meetings to talk about the anti-Semitism which is springing up in the rural areas, how the rural people are being told that an international conspiracy of Jewish bankers together with the Federal Reserve System, the Trilateral Commission are in a conspiracy to steal their land from them and they have no help. Then there will be people quoted in various Legislatures saying anti-Semitism should not be the ticket. We try to tell the farmers what you are saying is not true, yet everything that happens in the Legislature coincidentally goes the direction that these people were talking about a conspiracy alleged they will go. The representatives of the banking industry will stand on this floor and say take somebody's home from them, and that is exactly what is being done here. They like to keep it in sterile economic dollars and cents terms so we don't think about the impact on the human
