And I'm hoping that that is what will happen once this bill is enacted into law. And I'm supporting the amendment. And I'm not going to prolong the discussion of the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Thank you. Senator Goodrich, please.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Mr. President, members of the body, would Vard Johnson respond to a question or two?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Vard, please.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Senator Johnson, the deed of trust you are talking about, that is in your amendment now, right?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes, yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: And is that on rural land only?

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Yes.

SENATOR GOODRICH: And it is clearly set out that it is not urban land or real estate.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: No, never been our intention to affect urban land. It is on rural land only.

SENATOR GOODRICH: Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Question.

SPEAKER NICHOL: That won't be necessary, but thank you. Senator, Senator, whose motion is this? Senator Vard Johnson, would you like to close.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I'm going to waive the closing, ask your indulgence. Put the amendment on the bill. It is an agreed to amendment, essentially, among some of the principle protagonists on the floor, and then advance the bill.
