CLERK: 20 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The house is under call. Will you please record your presence. Those not in the Chamber, please return to the Chamber and record your presence. Three are excused. Senator Chizek, Senator Goodrich, Senator Higgins, Senator Vard Johnson, Senator Labeledz, Senator Marsh, Senator Warner, Senator Rupp, Senator Pappas, and the question was, shall the Chair be overruled? Call in votes were authorized.

CLERK: Senator Chambers voting yes. Senator Vard Johnson voting no.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker, rather than wait around, let's just go ahead and expediate by a roll call vote, please.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Roll call vote, did you ask for, sir? Okay, a roll call vote and the question is, shall the Chair be overruled. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 2155-56 of the Legislative Journal.) 22 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion failed. Do you have anything else on the bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, no, sir, I have nothing further on the bill.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Now we're back on the bill. Senator Peterson.

SENATOR PETERSON: Mr. President, I just move to advance the bill to Final Reading.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Rod Johnson, did you wish to speak on that?
