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think it is prudent to go along with the Speaker's plan. We just have to realize that this happens every year. We should not make definitive plans in that last week of the legislative session because we can't predict what will happen. I would support the motion or the proposal to adjourn today and then come back and finish up next week.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Hannibal, please, then Senator Scofield.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Mr. Speaker, a question of the Speaker, if I may. Mr. Speaker, can you tell me what the procedure will be? I don't believe that you are listening, Mr. Speaker. I'll wait until you get off the phone.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Pardon me, I was busy and didn't hear the question.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: I'd like to know what the procedure would be for something like this. I understand that when this evening comes we could have an adjournment motion for adjourning until next Monday. But the procedure this morning, are we just going to have a discussion and try to decide, or are we going to have a vote, or what will be the procedure?

SPEAKER NICHOL: Well, my plan was to...I have several lights on, several that wish to speak. After everybody has spoken then we'll just take a straw vote to see how you feel about it. The Speaker will arrange the agenda accordingly. If it is unanimous one way or the other, of course, I'll plan it that way. But I did want you to know about this so that you could say something, and discuss it. It is open for discussion.

SENATOR HANNIBAL: Thank you. Then I would like to register my affirmative thoughts on it as well. I do understand very much what Senator Johnson is saying. We all have those situations. And I also would like to be out on schedule. However, the magnitude of the problem we are looking at right now, with revenues and with our budget situations, and the short time that we have, after having spent so much time on some issues here that aren't as important to some people as they are to others, that I think it behooves us to do anything that is within our power to make sure that the state comes out of this situation on a good, sound basis. If that requires us to recess for one day, in order to have an awful lot of information that we won't now have in time, I can do nothing but say that my obligations, my
