

overrides might be, what is vetoed. There is no way we're going to know in a couple of hours, with any kind of assurance, those real impacts. And I would hope that the majority of you would support the Speaker's proposal. As I indicated, the Appropriations Committee will meet, as required by rules, to make recommendations on vetoes. And, as you know, the rule is that if the committee makes no recommendations then it is wide open for any proposal. But I think at least we will be dealing with a known subject in that fashion. It appears to me that we could spend all morning trying to put three or four different combinations of tax rate adjustments, trying to anticipate what might be vetoed, and we're going to spend a lot of time and waste a lot of time because you only need one, if you know what you are talking about in terms of a budget. So I would urge the body to support the Speaker's concept. If it is an indication vote, Mr. President, that the great majority of you support the President in his concept, it doesn't short anybody any opportunities, but it will surely save time and, more importantly, it will let you cast a more informed vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Warner, while you are at your microphone, and the body should know, we have four bills on Select File, starting with 539 through 870. Would it be your recommendation that we take those up today, or not take those up today?

SENATOR WARNER: None of them today.

SPEAKER NICHOL: None of them today?

SENATOR WARNER: Originally, I wanted to take some of them up, but I know that would take time and take time away from other bills, and we'd rehash it again Monday anyway. So...
